3 in 5

consider **cognitive screening** very important

4 in 5

consider **early diagnosis** very important

4 in 5

would want to know if they had Alzheimer's before symptoms appear or affect daily activities 9 in 10

would want a simple test to allow for early treatment

3 in 4

say having **treatments** that slow progression makes **early diagnosis** more important

9 in 10

would want a medication that could slow the progression of Alzheimer's disease following a diagnosis 3 in 5

would accept **moderate or high levels of risk** to take medication
that slows the progression of
Alzheimer's disease

Up to 4 in 5

feel optimistic about the future of Alzheimer's treatment
